- C) Treasurer's Report: 1) Current balance is \$844.68. Expenses since last report: \$30 for computer mailing label program; \$436.76 for printing/mailing 2014 Region Directory. 2) Thanks to Dean & Cinda for printing the last two

- Lines at their expense. Thanks to Bill Eby for being temporary editor. 3) 53 members agreed to accept *The Line* by e-mail which helps keep dues low. 4) Apology extended to Loretta Fusco. It was omitted in the MW Directory that she is the HHFC Merchandise Mgr.
- **D)** Old /New Business: 1) Hazel Wade will be our new Editor of *The Franklin Line*. Thank you, Hazel! 2) We are still asking Region members to write their personal stories regarding how they acquired their first Franklin, experiences they've had with these great cars, etc. Send your story (short or long) to Hazel for printing in *The Line*. 3) Midwest By-Laws: a) Sinclair Powell proposed we add Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota to the official list of Midwest Region states. Motion passed pending approval by the HHFC Board of Directors. b) A draft of Midwest Region By-Laws was printed in the fall, 2013 *Franklin Line*. At this meeting, changes

- **E) Midwest Region News: 1)** Roy Nelson is working on the history of our Region and reports he has been in touch with older members and found source material back to issue one of *The Franklin Line* and/or ACN. **2)** Upcoming Meets: printed elsewhere in this issue of *The Franklin Line*.
- F) The Franklin Collection: 1) Phil Weisenbarger (Chair) thanked the Region for supporting The Collection; board members of The Collection will be seeking donations as the endowment does not fully sustain the museum. 2) Marv Gage and Sandy Bennett: a campaign to raise \$250,000 begins next year; 4 cars were donated 1 sold, others hopefully sell between now and Nov. 2016; donor names are added to the plaque in the Franklin building.
- G) HHFC Board Representative: 1) Jeff Hasslen: Mid west Executive Committee needs help to keep the Region strong and growing. We need ideas and people to host. Meets can be casual with emphasis on friends and driving our Franklins. 2) Jeff stated the goal of The Collection was to remain small, educate visitors to the unique features of the Franklin and recruit new members and that goal is being realized. Jeff said new members John Moss and Marshall Larson both bought Franklins after visiting The Collection. Jeff asked Region members to promote The Franklin Collection and spread the word.
- H) Further Comments/Discussion: 1) John Moss spoke to the fact that he stopped at the Gilmore and the uniqueness of the Franklins sparked his imagination. He bought a Series 14 and a 10C. John thanked specific people for their assistance, inspiration and encouragement. He praised our Club and said "the people make the difference". 2) Pat Hogan: "We are called a Franklin Family." 3) Sinclair Powell: This April he attended the SAE conference in Detroit. Christine Gray and her 1909 Touring were invited to represent the Franklin's engineering features. 4) Christine Gray spoke about her experiences during that 3 day event.

Our host motel was the brand new Hastings, Michigan Holiday Inn Express. Although on the edge of Hastings, there was a nice coffee shop, a restaurant, and a carryout pizza parlor just across the street. So everyone settled in Wednesday evening to reacquaint themselves with Franklin friends and snack on M&M's. Thursday found us driving to the edge of Lake Michigan as we toured almost 66 miles to Holland for a luncheon cruise on the Holland Princess. The weather was not entirely cooperative. The day dawned cold and foggy and once we were on the way it changed to merely cold and overcast. On the way to Holland the group made a stop at the private car collection of Al & Carol Scholten. We appreciated the hospitality Al showed us and the interesting collection in his car barns. Then it was on to the Holland Princess.

The Princess took the group on a 2 hour tour of Lake Macatawa, and to the edge of Lake Michigan. The shore was peppered with the mansions of the rich and famous, and a few commercial places including the largest pickle factory in the world. The return trip Thursday had a little less wandering around the Michigan countryside, better weather, and included a stop at another car collection. The collection of Jim Cordes included several FWD trucks that Jim collected over his lifetime including while he was a FWD dealer. Jim and his family were friendly and full of stories about their cars and trucks. So Thursday was a long day both in terms of miles driven and interesting sights.

Friday found us a little closer to Hastings. The first stop was historic Charlton Park. Barry county started with a collection of historic artifacts assembled by Irving Charlton and has constructed a historic village of buildings moved from around the county. Our docents were cheery and knowledgable. We only had an hour at Charlton Park, but could have easily spent all morning there wandering through all the buildings. The next stop was the private collection of the Off Brothers. The Off Brothers collection is stunning. If you are interested in jaw-dropping cars, with the occasional fun mashup, this is the place for you. Lunch was at the Gull Lake Country Club with a tasty buffet and a terrific view of the lake. After lunch a short hop took us to Bill and Barbara Parfet's. The Parfet collection is just off the grounds of the Gilmore Car museum, and they had another top notch collection for us to peruse, including a couple of gorgeous wooden boats. Next, since the exit from Parfet's was via the Gilmore museum property, most folks took the opportunity to hang out at the Franklin Collection or noodle around the other Gilmore buildings. A couple folks also took the opportunity to snap a photo of their Franklin in front of the Hamlin/Franklin museum building. Saturday was a lazy day for the Franklinites, as we took a short, 22 mile, tour to the Gilmore and enjoyed the great weather at the Air Cooled gathering. There seemed to be a fine turnout of Franklins and other aircooled cars, trucks and even a motorhome. As the cliché goes, a fine time was had by all. After returning to the Holiday Inn Express, everyone enjoyed a fine meal catered by the Seasonal Grill. And then before we all knew it, it was time to say our goodbyes.

BY-LAWS OF THE H.H. FRANKLIN CLUB MIDWEST REGION

1. ORGANIZATION of the Midwest Region: A The Region is a duly recognized region of the H.H. Franklin Club. B. The Midwest By-Laws exist within the By-Laws of the H.H. Franklin Club and any conflicts within the By-Laws will defer to the parent Club By-Laws and/or the Board of Directors' decisions. C. The Midwest Region consists of, and is for the benefit of, dues paying members that reside in the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas. Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota and Wisconsin. Dues paying members of other states are welcome to join. 2. PURPOSE of Midwest Region: A. Promote the sport and hobby of owning, touring, and enjoying Franklin automobiles; educate others about the history of these fine aircooled automobiles.B. To encourage family participation in such recreation. C. To promote club fraternity of H.H. Franklin Club members that live in the Midwest regional boundaries by sponsoring two regional meets each year. 3. **OFFICERS:** A. All officers are elected by a majority of the members present at any meeting held concurrently with a regional meet. B. The Midwest Region will consist of four officers: President, Vice President, Secretary/ Treasurer, and Representative to the H.H. Franklin Club Board of Directors. C. Officers' terms are 3 years and fully eligible for re-election. D. Editor of The Franklin Line (the Midwest Region newsletter) is a volunteer position and not an officer. 4. OFFICERS' RESPONSIBILITY: A. PRESIDENT: The President will preside over all meetings and will act as an ambassador to any functions or activities held by the Midwest Region. The President will coordinate Midwest Region meet scheduling. The President will assure all regional offices are filled and regional responsibilities are performed. B. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President will assist the President as necessary and preside over meetings if the President is unable to attend. The Vice President will not automatically succeed the President but may be elected to that office. C. SECRETARY/ TREASURER: The Secretary/Treasurer will be responsible for the minutes for all meetings. They will be responsible for all monies received and disbursed by the Midwest Region, and make periodic reports of the Region's financial status. They will be responsible for maintaining the roster of Regional membership and collect dues from members. They will submit by January 31

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functions. B. Members should consider supporting the Region by volunteering for Regional offices and as meet sponsors to keep the Region operating soundly. C. Members must operate vehicles in such a manner that it will not cause embarrassment to the H.H. Franklin Club, the Midwest Region, its officers and members. D. Membership dues will be determined by members and paid annually. 6. MEETS/MEETINGS: A. Midwest meets will generally be three days in length, Thursday through Saturday. One meet will occur in the spring, and one in the fall. B. Each meet will be planned by a volunteer meet sponsor, and the content, date, duration, and amenities will be within the discretion of the meet sponsor. Meets may include some portion of touring; sightseeing; cultural, historical, and/or educational destinations; and socializing.C. The Region will make every attempt to have meets occur within the geographical boundaries of the Midwest Region.D. Meetings of the Midwest Region will occur during Midwest meets. E. Voting on issues at Midwest Region meetings will be by majority vote of members attending. F. Insurance coverage for Midwest meets is provided under the umbrella of the H.H. Franklin Club. 7. CHANGES TO THE BY-LAWS: A. By-Laws may be changed at a Regional meeting with a minimum of 10 day notice. Changes may be enacted by ma-

jority vote of members in attendance at the meeting.
